## Railroading Merit Badge

**If you have prepared ahead of time, you will be able to successfully complete these requirements and options during the class.**

- These requirements will be facilitated by the instructor / counselor during the class; however, the Scouts preparation work will ensure completion of these requirements on the day of the class.
- Requirement component 3c is the selected option by the counselor for Requirement 3.

2a

**Scouts will need to prepare ahead of time and be ready to share their explanations as well as their timetable plan for their rail trip.**

- The instructor / counselor will help facilitate discussion and review of this requirement with the Scouts' preparation work during the class.

7a1

**Obviously, the Model Railroading option will be the focus. Simply put, Scouts will need to draw their railroad layout and bring their work to class to share with the counselor.**
